Currently, HCPF and the 20 Community Centered Boards (CCBs) are working together on the With the passage of House Bill (HB) 17-1343 in 2017, the State of Colorado/Health Care Policy and Financing (HCPF) issued expectations regarding the implementation of

chosen along with the transition plan and timelines for compliance. The four options to choose from are: All 20 CCBs, including Foothills Gateway, must develop and submit a BCP to HCPF by July 1, 2018. The BCP must indicate which one of the four CFCM options the CCBs have

- 1. CCBs choose to become a case management agency only;
- CCBs choose to become a direct service provider only;
- CCBs choose to be a case management agency and direct service provider, but not to the same person as well as implement appropriate firewalls and safeguards to prevent conflict of interest; or,
- CCBs discontinue providing Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) case management and direct services

Once Foothills Gateway submits the BCP on 7/1/18, HCPF will have until 6/30/19 to review each CCBs' BCP to operations, and legal consultation will be utilized in developing the BCP for Foothills Gateway. Medicaid Services (CMS). Finalization of the new CMA and CM regulations are anticipated to be completed and reviewed by the MSB in the July-September 2018 timeframe. review/approval. Before the regulations can be presented to the MSB, the waivers and Medicaid State Plan changes have to be approved by the Centers for Medicare and by current CMAs. By the end of March, 2018, HCPF will draft the rules for CMAs and CM qualifications for stakeholder review and feedback. During the 2nd quarter of 2018 meetings in November, 2017 to gather input on CMA and CM qualifications. By the end of February, 2018, HCPF will release draft CMA and CM qualifications for consideration An additional requirement of HB 17-1343 was for HCPF to develop qualifications for case management agencies and case managers (CMA and CM).
